

17th April 2016 - 4th Sunday of Easter

The Sundays after Easter are like a mini-course in Christianity. In fact they are a seven week expose of everything we shouted about and sang about when we celebrated Christ's resurrection. If any new member of the Church, recently received, is beginning to wonder what exactly they have let themselves in for (or any old member for that matter!), the Sunday scriptures are aimed at explaining piece by piece the full implication of calling ourselves Christian.

So there can be no better copper-bottomed guarantee than the one Jesus gives when talking about the Good Shepherd.

He doesn't merely say that to follow him will be an acceptable way of spending time. He doesn't invite people to faith in order to give them something to do, like a hobby, a pastime, or even an alternative to a spot of voluntary work!

He says, as the Good Shepherd, that those who are his sheep and follow him will enjoy the richest of lives, and what's more nothing or no one will ever be able to snatch them from his hand. It's hard to think of anything that could be more unconditional than that.

His listeners were only too aware that it's easy to be taken in by some forms of religion, the type where the lambs get fleeced or even devoured by the wolves.



But to be held in the hand of the Good Shepherd is to have a different quality of life. Jesus calls it eternal life. And this eternal life does not just start after we die. It's on offer to us now. It's that life available to those who are part of the flock, who are held in God's hand, who make up the Body of Christ.

Following the Good Shepherd and listening for his voice goes beyond a nice countryside image. It puts us in the hands of someone who promises to make sense of our lives, to protect us from ultimate evil. It is the picture of a God who walks by our side and makes our faith and hope worthwhile.
