




ment to Jesus and so share more deeply in the joy of his resurrection? There is a mysterious character who appears from time to time in the Old Testament. Not much is known about this person except that he is going to be called on to play a big part in God's plans for the chosen people. He will suffer greatly and become a sort of scapegoat for the faults of the nation. Hence, he is known as the "suffering servant" of God. Today he appears in our reading from Isaiah and will reappear on Friday in the first reading: "On him lies a punishment that brings us peace, and through his wounds we are healed."
