10th April 2016 - 3rd Sunday of Easter



Jesus obviously looked different after his resurrection than before it. We can tell this because his disciples had difficulty in recognizing him. It even took Peter a while to work out who it was. Jesus was real, not just a ghost, but there was something new about him. Somehow his new risen life showed. If we were to bump into Jesus on the street today, how would we expect him to look? Would we recognize him? And if we were looking for him, where would we go? St John gives us a few clues in the last chapter of his gospel, a chapter some people think was added a long time after he finished the rest of the gospel. Maybe people had already started asking these questions?

Well, the first disappointment is that there is no photo-fit image of Jesus. In fact it's quite the opposite. Jesus looks as ordinary as all the people on the bus, in the supermarket or at the football ground. But that's the point. He's supposed to. Since God took our human form and redeemed it by dying and rising, if we are looking to find God then we need look no further than people like ourselves. The risen Christ lives in his people and especially those who are called to be his Church.

Christ who is risen becomes visible in those who minister his presence to us. This means not only priests and deacons, those who are ministers of the sacraments, but also those who take the time to talk to us when we are low, visit us when we are sick, share their own faith and hope with us at those special times.

If we are listening out for the voice of the risen Jesus, then we will hear it in his words proclaimed in scripture, or in those quiet moments when we open a bible. God has not stopped speaking to us, and the Word of God is audible in the words of scripture.

In the most perfect way the risen Lord shares himself with us whenever we gather as Church to eat his body and drink his blood. It is no coincidence that after his resurrection Jesus seems to appear at meal times! Sharing an evening meal with the Emmaus disciples or a breakfast of bread and fish on the sea shore, Jesus offers to be present whenever we share the Eucharistic meal. Yes, Jesus really is risen. Just take a look around.
